
Commonwealth v. Carnegie



ACROSS

- 1 HCF's Pittsburgh estate
- 2 coke baron: made a million before he was 23; "the most hated man in America'
- 7 AC bought this Scottish castle as a vacation home
- opened his speech with "On behalf of five thousand men, I beg of you to leave 29 here at once."
- 9 steelworker accused of throwing dynamite at Piinkerton barges; met Berkman while incarcerated
- the Homestead steel workers union (abbr.)
- 13 one of the first casualties, he was a 46year-old veteran of the battle of Gettysburg, but fell to gunshot wounds in the thigh and stomach thanks to a Pinkerton sharpshooter
- 16 19-year-old teamster; wounded slef with 40 rocky waste material cleared from own weapon; shot in the neck and killed by Pinkerton fire
- 17 AC got his start working for this railroad 41
- 18 AC died in 1919 in this Massachusetts
- 28-year-old Welsh immigrant; shot in the head at the pump house

- 21 one of two tugboats to pull Pinkerton barges to Homestead
- publsher of 'Freiheit', a German anarchist newspaper, as well as 'Science of Revolutionary Warfare'
- known as "old beeswax", he was burgess of Homestead in 1888 and 1889
- Russian-born anarchist; would-be assassin of HCF
- agency sent private police force early on July 6
- 32 On July 5, while the workers mobilized and the Pinkertons headed toward Homestead, AC was dedicating a library
- in this Scottish city. violence broke out in this factory town on July 6, 1892
- 35 governor of PA during strike
- 36 Pinkerton motto (three words)
- sheriff of Allegheny County in 1892; ineffectual leader
- metals during the smelting or refining of
- this VP candidate wrote to Frick, asked him to reopen negotiations with AAISW; Frick refused
- eventually Carnegie Steel's #2 shareholder; donation in 1893 of

- conservatory and botanical gardens still stands today
- Carnegie Steel is no more, but it lives on 23 in this current corporation (three words)

- 1 HCF's grandfather's land lay on a coal seam in this town south of Pittsburgh
- 3 he was Carnegie Steel's lawyer, and later US Secretary of State
- 4 Scottish hometown of Carnegie
- superintendent of Homestead works
- 1890 tariff bearing his name raised import duties, tried to protect US manufacturers
- 7 commanding officer of PA militia during Homestead occupation
- the two Pinkerton barges were called the Monongahela and this (two words)
- 11 teamster; only identified African-American to participate in the lockout
- On July 6, AC was fishing on this Loch
- 14 Pinkertons took the train to this town. then took barges to Homestead
- AC sold Carnegie Steel to this man in 1901 for \$400,000,000
- before Carnegie bought it, the Homestead mill was known as the

- Pittsburgh _ Steel Works
- 22 Homestead is on this river
- Berkman's lover and an even more notorious anarchist than AB
- 24 this building was AAISW HQ
- after his wife died, McLuckie went to work for this railroad in the southwestern US
- 27 other Carnegie operations struck in sympathy at Lawrenceville and here (two words)
- 28 28-year-old Slovak immigrant; shot and killed by a Pinkerton sharpshooter; bullet entered above his lip, blew his head off
- one of two tugboats to pull Pinkerton barges to Homestead (two words)
- this militia member yelled "Three cheers for the man who shot Frick!" He then was hung by his thumbs for 20 minutes and had half his head and beard shaved in punishment
- 34 steelworker, union man, burgess of Homestead
- first iron works in N. America was built here, just 26 years after the pilgrims
- 23-year-old English immigrant; died from friendly cannon fire while his brother watched
